In accordance with Sanborn Regional School District policy, you are instructed to contact and report this exposure incident to your child's health care provider immediately and follow his/her recommendations for treatment and follow-up care.
<ol> <li>Your child/ward should be tested within 7 days of the exposure for the presence of HIV (Human Immunovirus), HBV (Hepatitis B) and HCV (Hepatitis C) antibodies.</li> <li>He/she should then be retested at 3, 6, and 12 months to be certain that exposure to HIV, HBV and HCV is not an issue. EXCEPTION: If the source of the exposure is tested and results are negative, you will be notified by your child's physician, and the follow-up tests at 3, 6, and 12 months will not be necessary.</li> <li>Complete the HIPAA-Compliant Authorization Form attached to the notification letter and return it in a sealed envelope marked, "Confidential" to your school nurse.</li> </ol>
While test results are pending, it is essential to avoid potential exposure to others: practice abstinence/use precautions during sexual contact, avoid pregnancy, refrain from donating blood, and avoid further direct contact with blood/bodily fluids. Any illnesses, accompanied by fever, during the twelve weeks following the above exposure should be reported to your health care provider.
