# Speaker: Lynn Lyons



Lynn Lyons is a licensed clinical social worker and psychotherapist. She speaks on the subject of anxiety, its role in families, and the need for a preventative approach at home and in schools. Lynn's newest book *The Anxiety Anxiety* offers an eye-opening look at the seven sneaky ways that anxiety and worry weave their way into our families, our friendships, and our jobs, and provides actionable steps to reverse the cycle and reclaim our emotional well-being. She also is the co-author of two books:

Anxious Kids, Anxious Parents: 7 Ways to Stop the Worry Cycle and Raise Courageous & Independent Children, and the companion book for kids, Playing with Anxiety: Casey's Guide for Teens and Kids.

This year we are excited to introduce Invention Convention to our school! The convention is a great way to allow students to problem-solve creatively and make the world a better place to live.

# All participants will be awarded a certificate!



Almost every day we use an invention that has made our lives easier or better in some way. Not all inventions have to be complicated. In fact, some of the best inventions happen by accident.

The Invention Convention will allow your child to think like an inventor. If your child decides to participate, he/she will be designing or improving an invention that will solve a problem in their home or community. All of the work is to be completed at home. Students should submit <a href="this "Intent to">this "Intent to</a> <a href="Invent">Invent" form</a> to register for the convention. <a href="Deadline extended">Deadline extended</a> to allow a bit more time for our inventors to work on their creations! <a href="Intent forms are now due by April 7th">Intent forms are now due by April 7th</a>.

The Invention Convention will be held on the evening of April 18th from 6-7 pm. All inventions will be allotted a tablespace of 3 feet x 3 feet. Due to limited space in the school, the inventions will need to arrive on the day of the Invention Convention.

Please limit yourself to helping your child only with time management skills and design work that requires adult supervision, (e.g., hot glue guns). Guide your child where necessary but let the final project reflect his/her own individual effort and design. At the Invention Convention, inventors will need to answer judges' questions about all aspects of design. To promote equality, we are limiting the amount each child may spend creating to \$30. Don't forget the power of recycled materials!

I look forward to sharing the joys of inventing with your child at the Memorial School Invention Convention, Tuesday, April 18th!
