Grateful Breath Exercise



- Take a full breath in through the nose and sit up a little taller. As you exhale through the nose, release the shoulders
- Take a few moments, with attention to breath, settling in to a neutral, upright posture.
- As you take a breath, say to yourself, "I am grateful for..." It can be simple, for example, a
 flower, the sun, or even just for the breath itself.

Time to get red carpet ready and join us for some fun on Friday, May 19th! More details to come...



Anxious Kids, Anxious Parents: 7 Ways to Stop the Worry Cycle and Raise Courageous & Independent Children, and the companion book for kids, Playing with Anxiety: Casey's Guide for Teens and Kids.
