# A Message From School Counseling

### Governor Launches Mental Health and Substance Use Support Resources

<u>Strong as Granite</u> is a platform that's raising awareness of the mental health and substance use support and resources available throughout New Hampshire. It's part of a coordinated effort to bring help, hope and healing to all Granite Staters.

Governor Chris Sununu, the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, NAMI New Hampshire, the New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services, and other stakeholders discussed the community impact of NH Rapid Response/988, and launched a new public awareness campaign for behavioral health promotion.

"When we're talking about mental health and suicide prevention, we're talking about people," said Governor Chris Sununu. "New Hampshire has focused our efforts on implementing systems that meet the needs of the individual. While we're recognizing Suicide Prevention Awareness Week, our efforts continue 365 days a year to put the community resources in place to reduce stigma and care for those in crisis."
