A Message From School Counseling

First, and Lasting Impression Count, Even on Social Media

For both Middle School aged and High School aged students, the lure of followers, likes and streaks is not going away. Students are reporting that the connections they make online, and the drive to feel seen, relevant, and active on social media apps have real-life impacts on their status, sense of happiness and cache. While many of us haven't a clue or care about our online persona, our students do.

While it may seem strange or unhealthy, some good can come from the implication that they do care how others perceive them on social. If we can help model, moderate, and teach the kids how their online persona can affect their future, safety and privacy, we can curb some of the negative interactions that might spill into real life with unintended consequences.

College admissions offices, hiring committees and human resource departments are turning to social networking sites like apps like Facebook to learn about applicants more than ever before. What's on your Facebook-is it appropriate? Would you be embarrassed if any of your images were seen by a college admissions officer or prospective employer?

A student's online persona and social media activity is a snapshot of who you are to a college admissions officer who doesn't know them. Try to get involved in what your student does online so you can be a partner in helping them create a positive digital/online persona. Teaching students to maintain appropriate, legal, and curated online personas will be important for the future because you never know who is looking...now, or later.

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION
for Newton and Kingston, NH

If your child will be five years old by September 30, 2024, and you are a ***resident of Kingston or Newton, NH***, you should consider registering your child for full-day kindergarten for the 2024-2025 school year. Please visit our school website at <http://www.sau17.org/3/home> and click **the 2024-2025 registration link**. Registration is done completely online. Documentation required to complete the registration process includes a current physical & immunization record and proof of residency documents. The Sanborn Regional School District has defined the following acceptable residency documents: a copy of a **current** utility bill (electric, cable, gas, oil) showing your name and address (no P.O. Boxes), **along with** either a signed lease, a notarized letter from Builder or Realtor, property tax bill, settlement document on a new home or a property deed. Registering early helps us plan appropriately. We ask that registrations be completed ***no later than Wednesday, May 1st***.

New Hampshire State Law requires all children to have had immunizations for DPT, Polio, Mumps, Measles, German Measles, Chicken Pox, and Hepatitis B before school entry. They also require each child to have a complete medical examination within one year before entry into kindergarten.

Incoming parent orientation is scheduled on **Wednesday, April 10th from 3:20-4:20 p.m.** at the D.J. Bakie School (see below for specifics). This event is designed for parents/guardians and their students! This event is focused on visiting kindergarten classrooms, meeting the teachers, and seeing their classrooms. There will be an opportunity to meet our unified arts team and see other specific programs at a later date. The schedule is as follows:

Time:

3:20-3:50 If your Last Name begins with A-M

(If you have older students or PreK students, please park at Swasey after pick-up and walk over. Please do NOT park in the lot here)

3:50-4:20 If your Last Name begins with N-Z

We are excited to have you share the opportunity to visit classrooms and speak with our staff!

All incoming kindergarten students are required to participate in a screening process. ***You must register your child so that they may participate in the screening.*** Screening dates will be announced at a later time.

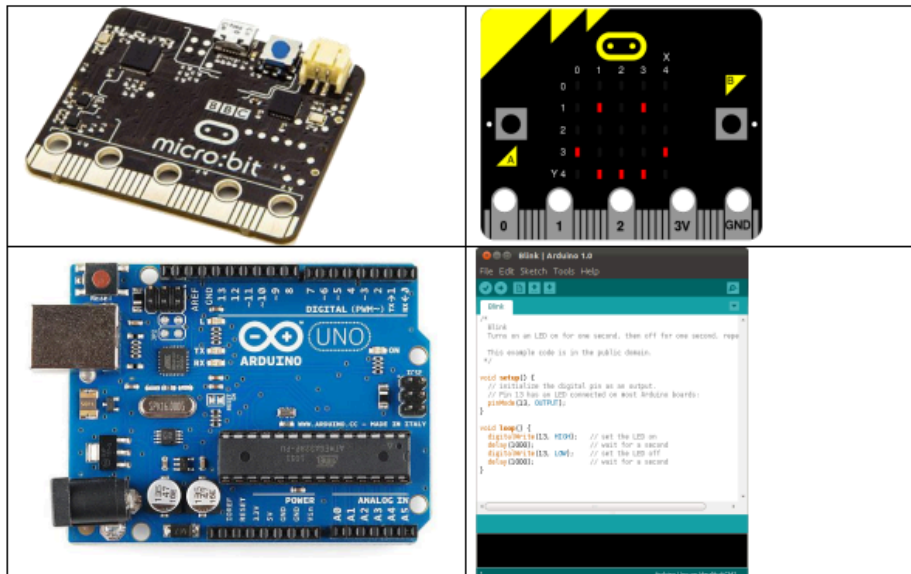

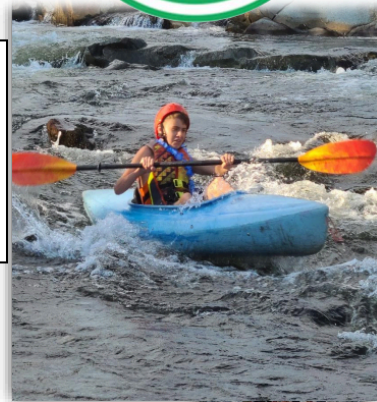
Ryan's Message
