Greetings Sanborn,

What an amazing week! We had our first ever Sanborn Field Day followed by the senior class trip to NYC! The weather was perfect and both events were terrific!

We wanted to reiterate the end of the year events coming up this week and the senior obligations. I have included a link [HERE](#) to the live document with the list of events. This information has also been sent via email and School Messenger (I do not want anyone to miss it). A few things to note:





- Seniors need to have all obligations fulfilled before receiving their cap and gown. This includes:
 - All athletic uniforms and equipment returned (with the exception of any spring sports still in season).
 - SCOIR updated for the school counseling department.
 - Lunch balance paid in full.
 - All library books/materials returned and/or paid for.
 - Chromebook returned or purchased - can be purchased for \$20.
 - All dues paid.
- In the event of inclement weather, graduation will be held ***indoors*** in the gymnasium. Each student will receive 6 tickets. Tickets will be given out when students receive their cap and gown on June 5th (***tickets are only needed if graduation is indoors***). Additional guests will be able to sit in the auditorium to watch the live broadcast. The call will be made on Wednesday, June 7th.
- Class day is open to families. If it is outside, then you do not need to sign in with the main office. If it is indoors, you will need to sign in.
